All staff will be trained in licensing issues, CCTV is installed and reviewed regularly, there will be a zero tolerance in any shape of anti-social or drunken behaviour This will be achieved by effective and responsible management of the premises at all times, crucial is the recruitment of the right staff and their subsequent training and support

By still limiting the opening hours, the premises will still appeal to a particular clientele who are wanting to enjoy a nice quiet drink possibly before a meal or to enjoy a quiet conversation with family or friends. The hours of opening are restricted to the time of 1200-2300 to limit any risk of excessive noise emitting from the premises

There will be no permitted access to premises 45 minutes prior to closure

The occupancy maximum will never be exceeded thereby reducing the risk of crime and disorder, public nuisance

Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
  - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
    - a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
    - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community

hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.



# Objection to an Application re a variant in Licence for The Hoptimist, 91 Sitwell Street, Spondon, Derby, DE21 7FH

I wish to object strongly to the above application on the grounds of prevention of public nuisance through the generation of noise.

the last 10 years and 7 months. I have loved living in such a prime location in Spondon Village and being part of the community.

I live here with my husband, his son and his partner. We have a large family who regularly visit us along with our four Grandchildren who are all under 8 years of age. We have both the space inside and outside in the large garden to accommodate wonderful family gatherings. It is also a regular occurrence for the Grandchildren to sleep over with us.

Since the Hoptimist opened last year, we have suffered with having to listen to loud conversations, drunkenness, foul language, music, having to sleep with our windows shut due to the loud noises and many early deliveries of stock. When The Hoptimist first applied for the change of premises and a licence they sated it would be a place for the community to gather for board games, cards, etc. They also stated smoking would not be tolerated but they currently allow smoking in an area in the premises, and we often find customers standing smoking outside of our entrance to our premises and cigarette debris discarded. They also specified they did not wish to have any music of any kind and we now find they are wishing to stay open until Midnight 6 days a week with live music and recorded music (which they already do, as we have heard music playing!!). We feel this will cause us even more disturbance than we are already struggling to cope with.

I work for the NHS in the largest GP Practice in Derby with a start time of 7.00am 5 days a week and also suffer with my mental health with sleep being a major part of my illness. The longer opening times will not help my mental health and I fear my work will suffer.

We are unsure if you know the layout of both our buildings, so we have attached a sketch with measurements for you to see. The building at the back of the brick building is made from corrugated sheeting and the roof is made from a thin fibre glass, which we know is not insulated... hence all the noise. They are also in the process of building a further extension to the back of the corrugated unit along with a decking area which backs on to our garden and has easy access to look into our lounge area.

We had a request from our Landlord Mr Hind to remove a camera from the side of our building as this overlooks the new extension as per the owners of The Hoptimists request. This camera has been in situ for the last 5 years since having a break in. We have not removed this but lowered it as we feel our premises can be accessed from The Hoptimist.

Whilst we understand we are not the only dwelling who will suffer with the application as there are also families who live to the right of the property and towards the rear, they too have been suffering from the noise.


The tenants have told me that the current licensing hours do cause some disturbance due to noise levels. That is without the granting of a music licence and extending the hours to midnight on six days each week.



- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)Where P = D + (DxV)

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014**

- 1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."
- (2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;

- (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
- (a) holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures —
- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises: and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

The Premises License Holder, Designated Premises Supervisor or person in charge of the premises must be able to retrieve and copy any recording/images at the time of asking or within 48 hours if so required. 
