# **Review of Hospital Car Parking Charges - Final Report**

#### RECOMMENDATION

1.1 The Social Care and Health Commission is asked consider and approve the final report on the Review of Hospital Car Parking Charges for submission to the Derby Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.

#### SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Commission agreed to review Hospital Car Parking Charges at the Derbyshire Royal Infirmary and the Derby City General Hospital at its 19 July 2004 meeting. It received evidence from a range of witnesses including the Derby Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust, Council's Traffic engineers and a local bus operator. The Commission also consulted the patients and visitors to the hospital, Council's Advisory Committees, Patients Forums and the Derby Seniors Forum.
- 2.2 The draft final report was sent to the Foundation Trust for their comments on the factual accuracy, in accordance with the overview and scrutiny of health guidance. These have now been incorporated in the final report.
- 2.3 The attached report makes 15 recommendations under nine separate headings on the parking charges and related issues. Members are asked to consider and approve the final report for submission to the Derby Hospitals NHS Foundation Trust.
