FOOD LAW ENFORCEMENT PLAN 2009/2010

SUMMARY

1. Each year the council must produce a Food Law Enforcement Plan. This plan is required to identify the obligations placed on the Council by The Food Safety Act 1990, the Food Hygiene (England) Regulations 2006, the Official Feed and Food Controls (England) Regulations 2006, The Food Labelling Regulations 1996, The Agriculture Act 1970 and The Animal Health Act 2006 and the resources made available to officers to discharge these obligations.
