25/06 Apologies for Absence

26/06 Late Items Introduced by the Chair

There were no late items.

27/06 Declarations of Interest

There were no declarations of interest.

28/06 Application for a variation of Premises Licence at Derby Promenade

The Sub Committee considered a report from the Corporate Director of Environmental Services that detailed an application for a variation of premises licence at Derby Promenade.

The application was received on 24 October 2006 from Derby City Council. Barbara Wheildon attended and addressed the Sub Committee.

The variation applied for was for the removal of the supply of alcohol and to add the exhibition of films and extend the terminal hour for all activities to 23.00.

It was reported that a representation had been received from a member of the public. Ms Jane Temple attended and addressed the Sub Committee

Resolved:

- 1. **to** grant the variation of the Premises Licence for the Derby Promenade, Derby in the following way:
 - to remove the supply of alcohol from the licence;

- to extend the types of entertainment to be licensed to include exhibition of films, indoor sporting events and boxing and wrestling entertainments; and
- to amend the hours for all the licensable activities authorised under the Licence to Monday – Sunday 08:00 – 23:00.

In view of the fact that the Premises Licence will no longer authorise the supply of alcohol, the following conditions will be removed:

SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licencea. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
 at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
- 7. In order to promote the 4 Licensing Objectives, the following additional conditions will be attached to the Licence:

MANDATORY CONDITIONS – EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1.1 No film shall be exhibited unless:
 - a. it has received a "U", "PG", "12A", "15", or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
 - b. it is a current news reel which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.

1.2 "18" Films

No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

1.3 "15" Films

No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

1.4 "12A" Films

No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.

1.5 "PG" Films

Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.

- 1.6 "U" Films Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a "U", certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 1.7 Permission of Licensing Authority Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

CONDITIONS RELATING TO THE PREVENTION OF PUBLIC NUISANCE

2. You must nominate a representative to receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all licensable activities and during the time that customers are leaving the premises. You must take immediate action to investigate the complaint and take reasonable steps to address the problems raised. A record of these complaints and of any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a log book kept specifically for that purpose. The log book shall be made available for inspection by an authorised officer of the licensing authority on request.
