
How important would the following be to you if deciding to hire a bike? Please select one option on each row. (Bike hire stations in convenient locations)




How important would the following be to you if deciding to hire a bike? Please select one option on each row. (Good quality / comfortable bikes)







Would not hire a bike - I have my own

These are in other cities and are well used. You would need to have a good many bikes in popular situations at a reasonable price and not in need of repair. What happens when something goes wrong with the bike while you have it? This is a good scheme for people who don't own a bike or don't have facilities for keeping it - Cost of repair and inconvenience while repair is being done - they can use your system.

Safety Equipment to hire alongside the bike, for example cycle helmets, bike lights and high vis jackets.

Having the physical strength to ride a bike.

Cycle routes which are not on roads and hire locations are the most important aspect for me. I would not consider hiring a bike without this.

Safe routes in terms of personal safety in certain areas

Cycle lanes on the shortest route. The route from Derby High School roundabout in Littleover (on the route for all Littleover & Mickleover residents) to Rolls-Royce at Sinfin has either the A5111 ring road or Wilmore Road. Wilmore Road needs cycle lanes as it is a 40mph zone. The Wilmore Road route at 4.7 miles is 1.1 miles further than the ring road route at 3.6 miles; for cyclists the distance matters a lot. The ring road is unsafe for cyclists; I have seen them knocked off their bikes, especially near the Showcase cinema. Another bridge across the railway would help, by providing an alternative route.





If I were to cycle to work (if changing rooms/showers were available) I would use my own bike, but if I didn't have a bike I think it would depend on the cost of hiring one.

It would be based in the city centre, where my journey to work is from Littleover to Sinfin. Public transport does not go where I want to go, and it is dangerous to cycle on 40mph roads without cycle lanes, so I am stuck with the car.

## Please tell us below why you would not be likely to use a Cycle Hire Scheme if it was introduced.

See previous answers, however I think anything that encourages people to travel by bike is an excellent proposal for the environment/health. People may be more inclined to make shorter journeys I think if hire bikes were available in the city centre. A main problem is the lack of safe on road cycling routes particularly for women as the alternative is canal pathways which many women would feel uncomfortable cycling on.

I walk to work and I have my own bike for other things.

Own a bike already, need a car for work visits

Unlikely as would not want to have a shower etc once arriving at work. Also would take longer to get to work than driving.

Roads are not safe for cyclists

I don't live locally enough.

I work 15 miles away form my place of work. I couldn't cycle 30 miles per day

I think this is a great idea. But I would use my own bike as I go straight to and from my work place

I just wouldn't feel safe on the existing roads. No 20mph default across the whole city. Very few protected cycle tracks like Leicester and other cities are adding - not even on new roads (London Rd Bridge, Infinity Park). The few that exist require people on bikes to give way at every side street and driveway (Harvey Road). No stopping-up of rat runs to reduce motorised traffic on residential streets. Just sporadic legalised-pavement-cycling permitted along busy roads, which suits neither people on bike nor on foot but antagonises both. You're putting the cart before the horse. Get the road environment fixed and we can ride our own bikes around. Lack of bicycles isn't the problem! (Bangs head exasperatedly)

Too dangerous. Derbyshire roads are not safe. Cyclists and cars do not mix. Cycles and pedestrians do not mix. City is either race track roads or pedestrian areas. Neither suitable for bikes

I'd be unlikely to use it because I don't live in Derby. So generally I will either cycle all the way to work, or drive. I might make the odd journey around Derby City where bike hire makes sense, but this would be a rare occasion.

Due to family commitments, there is insufficient time to get children to school, get to work, shower, change and start work on time

My answer would be maybe if there was an option. I would potentially hire if I could do a partial journey or use for exercise during a lunch break.

i live 26 miles away from work so not really an option for me

I live too far away and it is not practical so of no use to me.

I currently own a road bike which I use to commute from Nottingham to Derby. I am not sure how I can benefit from a cycle hire scheme, but think it is a good idea that could benefit a number of colleagues

I live too far from work and there are time restraints from dropping daughter off at school to my start time so it is just not feasible.

I wouldn't ever hire a bike. its dead money. I would buy one so I could keep it.

i have a new(ish) bike but my commute is usually by car. my commute is too far to use a bike alone, but not far enough to use multiple methods, plus I have to drop off/collect children en route.

# If you have any other comments about a potential Cycle Hire Scheme for Derby, please tell us below.

I would be concerned about the cycles being stolen, I imagine the organisers would look at existing systems and see how they use security. I have just returned from Amsterdam and there are so many cycle hire places there, it's great to see Derby persuing this. I think that cycling is brilliant and I'd love to see even more traffic free routes in Derby and the surrounding area as safety is a major concern for me, I had many, many near misses with cars etc.

If it is a reasonable cost to hire and all of the facilities are available: where to take it if a puncture happens brakes snap etc. If the hire location is available at hours which coincide with the hire -weekday working hours and related hours to and from work. For it to work hirers do not want the stress of not being able to contact the hire sources where applicable

I think it is really really important for safe cycle lanes to be provided to help existing cyclists and to encourage new or less confident riders to get on their bikes!

The cost is very important and where the bikes are situated. if I felt the cost was to expensive then I would not use it has I walk to work weather permitting, and this does not cost me anything financially.

I would like to have bike confidence courses

Personally, I would like to see any available funds to be spent on new cycle paths / safe cycle lanes in & around Derby. I doubt that there would be much demand fro bike hire in the city.

Derbys roads arnt big enough for cyclists. They'd need separating from road traffic. You havet made provision for this in the past with your road planning. Now it's too late and would be too costly. Give us bigger and better roads because we'll end up driving electric cars anyway. Let's look at Infinity Way one of your latest projects. You could have included separate cycle ways along side - you didn't. You have provided bus stops there that intersect the carriageway. This will potentially cause accidents and aggravation when there being used by buses. Plus I'm sure the bus drivers not find them at all comfortable sitting in the middle of the carriageway. You really have got to use common sense when applying department of transport guidelines. They don't get everything right, use your judgement when applying their directives. Plus what the curb that juts out into the carriageway just after the island near the shops at Chellaston - it's an accident waiting to happen

It is a very good idea but safer routes are needed as the main roads in Derby are very busy. Cycle awareness lessons would be a good idea

The only ting that strikes me is that when you have your own bicycle you know it and how it operates. If you hire a bike you don't know what you are getting.

There would need to be more money spent to link park and ride zones to cycle paths to make commuting safe for cyclist and our roads need to major money spent on pot holes resurfacing to make the roads safe for car users and motor bike ( given that they actually pay road tax)

Could be a good idea as it would encourage excercise & reduce congestion & in some instances be quicker tha car or public transport during busy periods of the day.

Would be good for leisure as well as for work. Bus out to hire station and cycle to one further in would be a healthy leisure activity. Could be combined with footpath network to give varied leisure exercise combinations.

Brilliant idea if the cycle routes are maintained to an excellent standard and if the charges are kept to a minimum for those not fortunate enough to be able to purchase their own bikes.

I would possibly be prepared to hire a cycle, dependent on cost, location, for how long and if cycle helmets were provided. Health and safety you know?!?

I live in Chester but stay in hotel in Derby Mon -Friday so would use it as a means of local transport to meetings in and around Derby

It's a good idea in principle, but Derby city centre roads are not safe enough for someone to just have a go. If you want to cycle you are better of buying a cheap, but well maintain second hand bike and practicing somewhere quiet.

Opening Hours would need to be able to accommodate early morning commuters. Needs to be easy to access. Cost would have to be low.

## If you have any other comments about a potential Cycle Hire Scheme for Derby, please tell us below.

I'd be keen to see 'pay as you go' and a membership scheme to offer greater flexibility. Also I'd prefer 'step through' bikes with a basket and pannier rack.

Waste of time. Bikes are cheap enough if your fool enough to want to use one

I'd want to be able to take the bike home and ride it in the next day

Considerations for child seats / trailers and harnesses would be an added benefit for Derby city residents with small children. Additionally considerations for adapted bikes for people with additional needs or disability's would be beneficial. There benefit might be the option to hire / try a different type of bike. Trike, BMX, Road bike / racer, Mountain bike, full suspension, front suspension, fat boy tires etc. Cycle fun days could be held at Alvaston Park / Derby Arena where a variety of bikes are available such as penny farthings, uni cycles, quad family cycles, recumbent cycles etc. For one of only a handful of city's within the UK that has a velodrome Derby City should be putting cycling on the map in any way possible.

Don't forget the outskirts of the City. E.g. Oakwood.

YOU'D NEED TO DRASTICLY IMPROVE THE CYCLE ROUTES AROUND TOWN TO KEEP AS MANY OF THEM OFF THE ROADS AS POSSIBLE. THEY'RE A FLAMING MENACE!

I think its a great idea to help reduce pollution for the local community and get people fitter. I fully support any form of cycle hire in the city

I have used cycle schemes in other cities uk and within Europe and they work really well

The size of bike would be really important to me as I am only just over 5 foot. Therefore the ease in changing seat height would be essential. Having enough bikes to meet demand. I would hate to ride a bike in and then find I had no bike available for the return journey.

I would find Cycle hire scheme very useful and hope that it is implemented. Would also hope that helmets would be provided.

Please develop a safe cycle route from city centre to Royal derby hosp. It's dangerous up to rowditch from centre and I do the journey a lot. Other cycle routes are great and a big plus to the city

The cycle scheme is a good idea, however, Derby is not great for cyclists. Cycle tracks often come to an abrupt ending.

It must cost less than travelling to work by car. (roughly around £6 a day)

I have regular meetings in Nottingham. I am sure other Local Authority employees have regular meetings with neighbouring Councils. It would be helpful to consider how schemes in different areas can fit together seamlessly for the customer to allow staff to mix their travel options.

Good idea - I wouldn't want to cycle all the way to work and back but would use it to commute locally

I would use a cycle hire scheme if I needed to get to a meeting and didn't have my bike with me (if it wasn't easy to park in a car), or if I needed to leave my bike for maintenance etc., I would hire a bike to ride home and back again in the morning. It would be handy to have convenient pick up points around the city areas and be able to drop them off at alternative locations. The condition of the bike would be important, I wouldn't want to find myself needing to change the tyre (unless it was punctured at the time) or oil the gears for example, they would need to be as reliable as your own bike.

Simple bike maintenance course, eg: how to fix a puncture, how to put a chain back on. Also how to use the bike, gears, brakes etc.

Need cycle hire hubs in both the city centre and suburbs

Not just a city centre scheme, please, some suburban locations also required

This would be a great boost to the amenities of the city and is long overdue. BUT it needs far more realistic work to be done on advancing the cause of the bike around the city. Some of the cycle lanes are not worth having. Some are ridiculously incomplete. Some are unnecessary. The scheme is a definite must but it will need proper promotion and profiling locally AND investment in the local infrastructure. If you are tempted to do it on the cheap, without doing it properly might as well not bother because it will undermine the service and it won't realise the potential there clearly is.

## If you have any other comments about a potential Cycle Hire Scheme for Derby, please tell us below.

The principle is sound, however, there is insufficient information to understand whether a London style network is envisaged or a few strategy located and manned facilities. For a commuter network, the largest single barrier is likely to be facilities at workplaces - i.e., absence of adequate facilities. This in turn leads to considering the likely user - a regular commuter is more likely to buy a bike. a hire scheme is targeted at irregular and occasional users. Further research and information is needed.

It would suit the city centre. Buses are too expensive compared to car parking but bike hire should be cheaper. Bikes suit flat routes. Derby is quite hilly towards Littleover but other areas might benefit more. Former railway lines are good because they are flat. Cycle routes need to allow cyclists to do a steady 20mph for a long distance, without messing about with gates and chicanes. A route along the former Great Northern railway line would help, from the Great Northern pub in Mickleover, past Kingsway roundabout and along to Friar Gate bridge. We also need a mountain-biking park in Derby, to save us having to drive all the way to Cannock Chase. A park was earmarked for the area south of Heatherton. This would encourage cycling for fun, for both adults and children. I feel the need for somewhere to go to have fun if I am to get on my bike again; A to B isn't enough.

Would want it to be available / marketed for leisure users as well as work / business

Although I don't work in Derby City I am a resident in Derby and I think a cycle hire scheme would be fantastic for encouraging people to get around the city more actively and reduce car usage in the city. As I live in the city centre I would make use of the scheme during evenings and on weekends as a form of transport to visit family and friends living in areas outside the city centre such as Mickleover & Littleover which are journeys I currently make by car. I think it is vital that the council invest in safe and where possible segregated cycle lanes in order for this scheme to truly be successful. I have used cycle hire schemes in both London & Melbourne, Australia and both were fantastic schemes with a model that I would recommend as a customer. If you look at the success of cycle hire schemes in city's such as Nottingham and the general impact of increased cycling in places like Manchester & London I think it is vital Derby increases cycling provision to encourage more people to cycle in the city.

I would like to be able to hire a helmet too Season tickets would be good as well as weekly and monthly prices. Free puncture repair would be great

I think this is a great idea as long as there are enough bikes to cover peak times and are always available.

I would definitely use it if a hiring place was available near the train station to enable to come by train instead of car.

I believe the potential introduction of a Cycle Hire Scheme in Derby could be good for people looking for leisure activities as well as commuting type activities. The availability of good, cheap hire bikes could improve the potential leisure activities both for local residents and tourists to the area giving easier access to places such as Darley Park and the Bass Recreation ground and other parks.

Before you increase the number of bikes in use in this town centre, please find a way to make it so that cyclists are absolutely not able to cycle on pedestrian footpaths. You'll need to plan and budget for some serious enforcement.

The roads are not safe and there are few off-road cycle routes, none for the route I take, and this will put off a lot of people.
