This Forward Plan supersedes all previous Forward Plans.

The Date of Consideration indicated is the earliest date by which it is proposed the Council Cabinet will consider the matter.

There are a cohort of children that need specialist support when transitioning from Tier 4 mental health provision, secure children's home placements, or require an alternative to inpatient or secure welfare. Recent national reviews outline the impact that the lack of appropriate provision has on the lives of vulnerable children.</p>

There is an obligation on Leaseholders to pay towards major works undertaken to the communal areas and the fabric of the building. Currently Leaseholders only option is to pay for these charges within one year of them being charged, as per their lease.
