17/15 Streetpride Devolved Budget 2015/16

The Spondon Ward Committee noted the Streetpride Devolved budget of £17,333 for 2015/16 and approves the allocation of funds for the following purposes against the Budget with the agreed conditions. An additional £303.14 from under spends in 2014/15 Streetpride budget is available to reallocate.

Raised kerb project on West Road for £3,500 cancelled. The funding was reallocated as follows:

- Additional CEO time £630. The 30 additional hours to be used patrolling Village Centre Poplar Avenue, Sitwell Street, Chapel Street in Village centre targeting parking on double yellow lines and on the footways behind them and as part of the parking campaign giving advice and enforcing parking across driveways on West Road schools.
- Concrete bollards £1,000. To install six bollards on the footways at junction of Devas Gardens and West Road
- **Too Fast signs £100**. To install four signs on Sancroft Road for a period of 6 weeks on suitable lighting columns
- Two parking signs £800. To install two low level signs indicating parking spaces and number behind Village Hall and also indicate location of Village Hall and Library on Sitwell Street signs. Subject to actual cost with any additional cost to come from unallocated funds
- **Tree £200**. To add to the one already funded and to contribute to replacement of the three recently damaged and removed
- Free Bulky Waste £200. To add to the £1,000 previously allocated
- Road closure £380. To add to the £1,040 previously allocated to cover the full costs of the Sitwell Street Road closures on Spondon Day and Spondon Alight.
