## **ITEM 10**

### **Update of the Derbyshire Health Protection Board**

#### **Purpose**

1.1 To provide the Health and Wellbeing Board (HWB) with an update and overview of the key discussions and messages from the Derbyshire Health Protection Board.

#### Recommendation

2.1 The Health and Wellbeing Board is asked to note the update report.

#### Reason

3.1 To ensure the Health and Wellbeing Board is kept updated on health protection issues affecting the population of Derby.

#### **Supporting information**

- 4.1 The Derbyshire Health Protection Board met on the 23<sup>rd</sup> June 2023. Key points of note for information of the HWB:
  - Reviewed an update to the Derby and Derbyshire Air Quality Strategy and a task and finish group has been established to develop an action plan.
  - Work has begun to develop the Health Protection Strategy and the initial scoping was reviewed.
  - An update was provided on the pathway for individuals with tuberculosis (TB) and no recourse to Public Funds.
  - The planned delegation of section 7a services (Immunisation services) was discussed and an update provided on work to improve the uptake of bowel screening by people with a learning disability.
  - It was acknowledged that a new provider for school aged immunisations will be in place from the autumn term and colleagues expressed their desire to rapidly build working relationships to support the programme.
  - A system-wide Infection Prevention and Control Implementation Group is being established to take forward the recommendations from a recent needs assessment.

- Influenza vaccination uptake in preschool children was noted to have been lower nationally and locally than 2018/19 and the Vaccination and Immunisation Delivery Board will have a particular focus on improving this, along with MMR uptake, over this coming season.
- The spring COVID booster programme had achieved around 70% uptake at this point, and plans are in place for the vaccination of clinically vulnerable 6 month to 4-year-old children. Plans are in development for the autumn booster programme, although the full cohort has not yet been confirmed.
- Work is underway to improve the uptake of the MMR vaccine across the city, particularly in view of the increase in cases in other areas.
