### Background

#### **Food Standards Agency**

- Statutory Code of Practice to produce inspection programmes
- Food Law Enforcement Plan Environmental Health & Trading Standards Roles
- Local Authority Enforcement Monitoring System (LAEMS)
- There are approximately 2600 Food Businesses in the city
- All food businesses are risk rated and must be registered with the Local Authority



#### Food Standards Hygiene Rating Scheme

- 5 hygiene standards are very good
- 4 hygiene standards are good
- 3 hygiene standards are generally satisfactory
- 2 some improvement is necessary
- 1 major improvement is necessary
- 0 urgent improvement is required

#### Impacts on Delivery

- Food and Safety and Trading Standards Teams heavily involved in the council's response to COVID 19
- Food work and business as usual activities severely disrupted
- COVID Secure Business advice on COVID requirements
- Personal Protective Equipment Trading Standards
- Avian Flu Confirmed case North of the City in December
- Further impact as restrictions ease and businesses re-open

### Food Standards Agency Advice

- Guidance issued by Food Standards Agency to Local Authorities
- Relaxed delivery of Food Controls June 2021
- High Priority Controls and Activities
- Appropriate interventions where concerns identified by the Local Authority
- Urgent reactive work food incidents, foodborne disease outbreaks, allergens and complaints
- Establishments subject to ongoing formal enforcement action
- Establishments overdue an enforcement revisit

### Developments







- Approximately 11m online food delivery users in the UK (2019)
- Most popular online provider in the UK is Just Eat (2019)



 Increase in demand from takeaways and home caterers for inspections.
