Update for Overview and Scrutiny March 2009

Introduction of the NHS Standard Contract for Community Services

- The NHS Standard Contract for Community Services will be introduced in 2009 for all providers delivering community services.
- The contract is structured in three levels
 - Nationally applicable standard terms
 - Must have elements for local negotiation
 - Elements for local agreement including service specifications
- The service specification is a locally agreed element of the contract which determines the agreed model for local service delivery of a specific service or care pathway.
- The programme of work to develop detailed service specifications for all community services is ongoing, progress to date includes:
 - A stakeholder event to begin development of a service specification for the Walk in Centre on 12 February 2009.
 - Public consultation on the future specification for Alcohol Services
 - Final approval of the specification for Community Matrons service
 - Consultation on the specification for HIV Specialist Nursing Service
 - Consultation on the specification for TB Nursing Service

'Business Readiness Standards for PCT Provision'

 NHS Derby City is working towards achieving greater separation between commissioning and providing services. Progress has been made on reaching the 'Business Readiness Standards for PCT Provision.

Transfer of services

- Psychological Therapy services procurement process is underway, final evaluation to take place mid March 2009.
- Epilepsy, Stoma Care, TB and HIV nursing services will transfer to the management of Derby Hospitals Foundation Trust when negotiations are complete.
- Negotiations are progressing with the Community Safety Partnership on the development of a service for new and emerging communities.
- Interpreter services procurement process is planned for April/May and Alcohol services in May/June 2009.
