RECOMMENDATIONS OF CROSS PARTY WORKING GROUP -FOLLOWING REVIEW OF LICENSING POLICY

SUMMARY

- 1.1 Derby City Council is the designated Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and is required to revise and publish their Licensing Policy which they apply when exercising their functions under the Act at least once every three years.
- 1.2 Before the revised document can be re-published it must be subject to a full consultation process.
- 1.3 Consultation commenced in June 2010 and ended in September 2010 and followed the procedures previously adopted when the Licensing Policy was last revised. This included a cross party working group considering the comments received during the consultation period and making recommendations.
- 1.4 This report provides details of the consultation and the recommendations of the Cross Party Working Group.

RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 To accept the recommendations/comments of the Cross Party Working Group
- 2.2 To endorse the Licensing Policy

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 The revised Licensing Policy needs to be approved by General Licensing Committee.
- 3.2 The Licensing Policy requires full approval by Council on January 19 2011.
- 3.3 The revised Licensing Policy needs to be published by the end of January 2011.

- 4.1 The proposed revised Licensing Policy is attached at Appendix 2. The revisions have been highlighted for your information.
- 4.2 The proposed revisions to the Licensing Policy were sent out for consultation in June 2010. Policy packs were sent to all Responsible Authorities and access to them was available from Derby City Council's web site, the Central Library, the Council House and Celtic House reception.
- 4.3 813 letters and information were sent to Premises Licence holders, 1850 letters and information were sent to Personal Licence holders and 57 letters and information were sent to pub companies and solicitors etc. There were 34 policy packs sent out.
- 4.4 11 responses to the consultation were received at the details of those can be found in Appendix 3.
- 4.5 The responses were considered by the Cross Party Working group on 24 September.
- 4.6 The recommendations of the Cross Party Working Group are found in Appendix 3.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

5.1 There were no other options available as the process and requirement to revise the Licensing Policy is set out in legislation/guidance from Government and the Home Office.
