- 2.1 Cinematograph exhibitions are required to be licensed under the provisions of the Cinemas Act 1985.
- 2.2 In considering an application to amend the conditions of the Cinema Licence, the Council is required to consult with the Police Authority, Derbyshire Fire and Rescue Service, Environmental Health and Trading Standards, Development and Cultural Services, Social Services (Child Protection Unit) and The Director Of Public Health. In considering an application the Council must have regard to any observations by these authorities.
- 2.3 The applicant must be informed of objections and given the opportunity to comment on them.
- 2.4 The Council does have the power to refuse the application.
- 2.5 A right of appeal to the Crown Court exists for any applicant who is aggrieved by the refusal of an application.
