Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Brown, Jones and F Hussain.

120/02 Proposals for Re-structuring the Overview and Scrutiny Commissions

The Commission received a report of the Chair of Scrutiny Management Commission, which detailed a proposal for restructuring the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Commissions. Councillor Graves explained that in preparing the report he had consulted Chief Officers and opposition leaders but had not heard from the latter.

Kate Owen, Democratic Services Manager, explained that a range of possible options had been considered, but it had been suggested that radical changes should be avoided because the Commissions were still relatively new.

Councillor Burgess acknowledged that the Lifelong Learning and Culture and the Social Care, Health and Housing Overview and Scrutiny Commissions had very large portfolios and agreed that something needed to be done to address this. However, he asked that a more radical change be considered in the near future. He suggested that better use might be made of sub-groups, and that the Commissions ought to be more streamlined.

Councillor Graves explained that there was too little time to give proper consideration to any radical changes to Commissions for the 2003/04 municipal year, but said that he was keen for the Commission to look into this matter soon in order that that changes could be suggested for 2004/05.

Councillor Redfern suggested that the Council's licensing function would fit best with the proposed Culture and Prosperity Commission rather than with Planning and Environment, but Councillor Graves disagreed with this suggestion.

Councillor Latham asked that the proposed Education Commission's remit make it clear what the Council's functions were as a Local Education Authority. This was agreed.

Councillor Graves reported that Council Cabinet had suggested that the 'Education Commission' be renamed the 'Lifelong Learning Commission'. Councillor Latham considered that 'Education' was clearer and therefore suggested that it should remain 'Education Commission'. When put to the vote this proposal was carried by six votes to two.

It was also reported that Council Cabinet were keen to include the word 'housing' in the title of the proposed 'Community Regeneration Commission'. However, when put to the vote, this proposal fell by two votes to six. It was therefore agreed that the name of the proposed Commission should remain the 'Community Regeneration Commission'.
