TN also asked what targets could be set to ensure the project's success? IG suggested that the application could be agreed by the board at their next meeting with a condition that ZB would draft some realistic targets for the next meeting. IG also suggested that the board could receive quarterly updates on the projects progress and informed the board that regular meetings of IG, ZB and the youth worker involved could ensure the board had some continued influence into the way of the project evolved. The board raised some concerns regarding the number of those benefiting from the project and whether £9000 was sufficient to achieve and sustainable outputs suggested by ZB.
