Report of the Strategic Director of Neighbourhoods

Environment and Regulatory Services Fees and Charges 2015/16

SUMMARY

- 1.1 The Neighbourhoods Directorate annually reviews its fees and charges across its range of services. This is to ensure that the fees and charges reflect the cost of delivering services, take into account comparator rates for these services within the sector, ensure that inflationary cost increases are taken into account, and that budget income targets are achieved.
- 1.2 The proposed fees and charges for Environment and Regulatory Services for 2015/16 are set out at Appendix 2. In those cases where the Council has discretion to set the fees, the default inflationary increase on the 2014/15 fees and charges is 6%. Where the fee increase notably varies from this, the reasons are set out in the report.
- 1.3 All prices are shown inclusive of VAT where it is applicable.

RECOMMENDATION

- 2.1 To approve the fees and charges for 2015/16 as set out at Appendix 2.
- 2.2 To authorise the Director of Environment and Regulatory Services, in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Planning, Environment and Regeneration, to approve revised fees for pest control if this service continues in 2015/16.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 To enable the Neighbourhoods Directorate to achieve its budgeted income targets for 2015/16.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 As part of the 2015/16 budget preparation, Departments within the Neighbourhoods Directorate have reviewed their fees and charges. This annual review is necessary to ensure that:
 - Inflationary cost increases (calculated at 6% for 2015/16) are incorporated into the charging structure where applicable;
 - Any additional costs (or efficiencies) of providing the service are incorporated;
 - Fees and charges reflect the cost of delivering the service and/or charging levels for that sector.
- 4.2 The proposed fees and charges for 2015/16 for the Environment and Regulatory Services Department are set out at Appendix 2. Some of the fees are set nationally and cannot be changed by the Council regardless of inflationary cost increases. Where the Council has the discretion to set fees and charges, most will reflect the agreed 6 % inflationary increase. However, in some cases greater increases (or decreases) have been proposed or alternative funding solutions found; in these cases the reasons for these variations are cited within the appendix.
- 4.3 The fees and charges relating to licensing functions have been excluded from Appendix 2, as these have been considered by the Council's General Licensing and Taxi Licensing Committees.

4.4 Bereavement Services

Due to significant over inflationary increases in previous years, across the full range of Bereavement Services Fees and Charges, it is not proposed to increase the main funeral related charges for 2015/6. However, in order to keep pace with planned percentage increases by the suppliers of post cremation memorials and other service related supplies. Memorial fees and charges will be increased the inflationary increase of 6%. These proposed adjustments are detailed in Appendix 2.

4.5 Markets

This is the first time that markets fees and charges have been reported since the service was transferred to E&RS in 2013. Most of the income generated by the service comes from stall rental that are linked to leases, licences and agreements with pre-determined renewal dates, therefore these are excluded from this report. However, detailed in Appendix 2 are the extensive schedule of ancillary fees and charges levied by the service.

In the main the increases have been limited to the standard 6% (rounded), there are however, a number of charges that management are seeking approval to simplify or consolidate to address issues that have become apparent since the service transferred. The two significant changes that are proposed relate to the Car Boot Sale, Cattle Market and Pride Park Street Trading.

Car Boot Sale and Livestock Market Associated Activities

The increases in these areas are proposed to offset some of the estimated £100.000 per. annum additional costs of providing 24/7 security at the site to prevent traveller incursions.

4.6 Pest Control

There is a proposal to end all domestic pest control provided by the Council in the draft 2015/16 budget; this is due to be considered by the Council at its meeting in March 2015 as part of the budget approval process. In view of this no revised pest control charges are included in this report. If the Council decides to retain the current level of pest control operation a detailed review of fees and charges will be required. It is proposed that delegated authority to approve these (if necessary) is granted to the Director of Environment and Regulatory Services in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Planning, Environment and Regeneration.
