Derby LINk Annual Report 2011-12

SUMMARY

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 1.2 Local Involvement Networks (LINks) were established in 2008 to give local people a greater role in influencing local services. They gather the views and experiences of people using health and social care services in their area and present these to health and care services, to improve the patient experience.
- 1.3 LINks also have a duty to publish their annual report which lists their activities during the year. The attached annual report provides a summary of activities carried out by Derby LINk during 2011/12.
- 1.4 The Health and Social Care Act 2012 has expanded the role of LINks and requires them to provide information and support to health and social care services. It has rebadged them as Healthwatch. Specifically the Healthwatch will:
 - ensure that the views and feedback from people who use services, carers and members of the public are integral to local commissioning
 - provide advocacy and support to people and help them to make choices about services
 - provide intelligence for Healthwatch England about the quality of providers

4.1 Derby Healthwatch will become an independent organisation and is expected to be up and running from April 2013.
