24/15 Streetpride Devolved Budget 2015/16

The Spondon Ward Committee noted the Streetpride Devolved budget of £17,333 for 2015/16 and approves the allocation of funds for the following purposes against the Budget with the agreed conditions. An additional £303.14 from under spends in 2014/15 Streetpride budget is available to reallocate.

The Spondon Ward Committee noted that two Cycling projects had not being delivered at West Park School After school club at £300 and Bikeability level 1 at St Werburghs School at £150.

The Spondon Ward Committee approves funding:

- **£450 to fund Protective Entrance Markings (PEM)** for Royal Hill Road area residents by reallocating the £450 from the Cycling projects. Propose to offer free PEM to residents who live in the immediate vicinity of the new footpath. First come first served up to the first 7 requests.
