4	<ul> <li>application for Neighbourhood Board Funding.</li> <li>Police Report</li> <li>Updates from the Safer Neighbourhood Team: <ul> <li>There are ongoing reports being made of a male indecently exposing himself in the vicinity of Chaddesden Park. As a result patrols have been stepped up in the areas where this is being reported. Officers have been into the local schools to raise awareness as it is young female who are being targeted. A suspect has been arrested.</li> <li>Chaddesden Park ASB – PSCO Simpson has spent a great deal of time concentrating on this area which seems to have had a positive impact The Big 1 on Chaddesden Park went very smoothly with no problems/ arrests. There was one incident whereby a child was bitten by a dog. PCSO Simpson is in the process of setting up a "dog watch" scheme whereby dog walkers who regularly visit the park can report incidents/ concerns about the park directly to him.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Drug warrants have been carried out within the ward. A local resident has been arrested and</li> </ul>

A local resident has been arrested and drugs have been confiscated along with money.</li> <li>ASB Chesapeake – over the months of May/ June whist the new MUGA was being completed there were some incidents reported to the police.</li> <li>The issues currently in the Ward are parking issues, neighbour disputes and football parking all issues which are difficult to focus on.</li> </ul>

	Burglary decreased by 65% Non dwelling burglaries decreased by 45.6% Theft from vehicle decreased by 18% Theft of vehicle decreased by 50% Interfere with motor vehicle decreased by 86% Damage and arson decreased by 44% Overall crime decreased by 15% Detection rates stand at 27.3% Overall there has been an excellent improvement on last year. Insp. Keene highlighted that perception of crime in the Ward is very often worse than actual fact. He also thanked Board members and the Community as a	
	whole for their support to the police. Chaddesden/ Area 1 is setting a benchmark on how well partnership working between all agencies is proving to be extremely successful and the work currently being done is being recognised by the rest of the city.	
	DP – Queried if Insp. Keene thought that the reduction in crime was due to the appointment of PSCO's? Insp. Keene stated that people have a divided opinion on PSCO's, however they do provide a visible street presence where beat officers may not be able to due to their high workloads.	
	JM – Queried about the person arrested in conjunction with the incidents of indent exposure, and that she did not think that the police had been to see pupils at West Park School. Insp. Keene advised that residents should still be vigilant at this time. As far as he was aware all schools had been approached however he will go back and double check with his team that West Park had been.	
	VM – Passed Insp. Keene photographs of inconsiderate parking. The issue of match day parking will be dealt with at the football parking meeting on 21 July 2010.

	Internet connection – The group have already budgeted separately for a phone line and Broad band	

	Connection. Security - Concerns were raised as to peoples security when creating documents such as CV's. Phil ensured to Board that no personal data would be stored in the computers hard drive, but on a USB stick instead. Participants would be encouraged to purchase one of these for themselves to keep their data on. Storage – The laptop would be stored at Phils house as it was believed it would be safer there than being stored at the cafe. Who will be doing the training – Phil explained that he would be doing the training as he had been doing at the resource centre. He has the qualifications to enable him to do this. JM expressed strong reservations about this bid being a qualified trainer herself. Note- Board members requested that in future all of the Board Paperwork be numbered from start to finish. Highways and transport – Lorraine told Board Members that they needed to be thinking about what they would like to spend 2010/ 2011 £10KHighways and Transport budget on. Suggestions for projects are included in the Board paperwork. Board members were asked to look at these suggestions and start giving serious thoughts about the H&T improvements people would like to see in Chaddesden Ward. It was noted that there was an error in the document regarding Highfield Road. This
