Report of Assistant Director, Highways, Transportation and Waste Management

Rolling out Rethink Rubbish Recycling into Oakwood, Chaddesden, Derwent, Spondon, Chester Green and Darley Abbey

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1.1 This recycling scheme is now successfully recycling over 40% of all household waste in Chellaston, Mickleover, Littleover, Allestree and parts of Oakwood and Chaddesden. On 9 November 2004 the Council Cabinet approved, subject to budgetary confirmation, the further roll out of this service into the remaining areas of Oakwood and Chaddesden and the additional areas of Spondon, Derwent, Chester Green, Darley Abbey and Alvaston in 2005. The scheme will therefore be rolled out across the whole of the Area Panel 1 area during 2005.

This scheme is part of the Council's Recycling Plan, which was approved by Cabinet in July 2002 following the publication of the national waste strategy (Waste Strategy 2000). In this strategy the Government has confirmed a series of national and European waste recycling and recovery targets for local authorities. If Derby City Council is to achieve it's recycling targets it must introduce radical proposals to recycle large quantities of household waste. If the Council does not achieve these targets, it could be deemed to have failed to deliver Best Value.

The scheme operates on an alternate week basis and is a partnership between residents and the Council to divert large proportions of the domestic waste. It will ensure that the city can be proud of having a sustainable waste management system that avoids the need to rely on landfilling most of its recyclable materials. Garden waste, cans, glass, plastic bottles, paper, magazines and textiles are collected for recycling on alternate weeks to the normal black bin. All residents are advised of the scheme by post and invited to attend exhibitions in advance of the first collections. A Project Summary document has been produced to provide fuller details of the scheme. This will be available at the Area Panel meeting.
