- Number of approved foster carers: 165
- CLA accessing education from the children's homes Snapshot taken on 19.6.06:
 - A Total of 38 young people in the children's homes
 - 18 have full time timetables (12 in mainstream, 4 at the Pupil Referral Unit (PRU), 1 refusing to attend)
 - 12 have part time timetables (6 in mainstream, 6 at the PRU)
 - 4 have no school placement places being sought
 - 2 are in a secure unit
 - 4 with school provision are choosing not to attend

- Number of CLA not accessing education from foster care:
 - 1 is not accessing education as they are refusing to access provision
- Number of cautions and convictions (aged 10yrs plus):

17 out of 198 children offended (8.6%), compared to Home Office Statistics for Derbyshire of 3% resulting in a ratio of 1:2.8 of children looked after offending compared to the general population

- Health of CLA (looked after for 12 months or more):
- Out of 285 children looked after for 1 year or more, 248 had a dental check and 254 an annual health assessment.
- Stability of placements of CLA- the definition is:

The percentage of children looked after at 31 March with three or more placements during the year

- The outturn figure at year end 31 March 2005 was 9%, with a target for 05/06 of 9%
- Derby 04/05 figure was 8.4%
- Comparator authority figure for 04/05 was 13%
- Employment, education and training for care leavers- the definition is:

The ratio of the percentage of CLA on 1 April in their 17th year (aged 16) who were engaged in education, training or employment at the age of 19 to the percentage of young people in the population who were engaged in education training or employment at the age of 19

- The outturn figure for 31 march 2006 was 84% (21 out of 25 cases) which compared to the population within that age group (81%) results in a ratio of 1:1.04
- Derby 03/04 figure was 1:1.16
- Comparator authority figure for 03/04 was 1:1
