#### What is a Local offer?

The Local offer will provide information about all the services and support that is available to Care Leavers from Derby City Council. The Offer will include information about your statutory entitlements (services and support we **must** give you by law) in addition to any extra support that Derby City council may **choose** to provide.

Derby City Care Leavers were consulted with regards to the offer and the offer will be published and reviewed annually.

The Offer is open to all Derby City Care Leavers regardless of where you might be living.

#### PA to 25

Following changes introduced by the Children and Social Work Act 2017 you will be able to ask for support from your Personal Adviser and the Leaving Care services up to the age of 25, whether you are in education or training or not. If you have left the service and are still under 25 then you can contact the Leaving Care Service for further information on how to access the support you need.

#### **Corporate Parenting Principles.**

Section 2 of the Children and Social Work Act 2017 also requires the Local Authority to show how they will provide a service to Care Leavers using the following Corporate Parenting principles.

#### What you can expect from your Corporate Parents.

- to act in the best interests, and promote the physical and mental health and well-being, of those children and young people
- to encourage those children and young people to express their views, wishes and feelings
- to take into account the views, wishes and feelings of those children and young people
- to help those children and young people gain access to, and make the best use of, services provided by the local authority and its relevant partners
- to promote high aspirations, and seek to secure the best outcomes, for those children and young people
- for those children and young people to be safe, and for stability in their home lives, relationships and education or work; and
- to prepare those children and young people for adulthood and independent living.

To be able to get the support set out in this offer, you must have been in care for at least 13 weeks between the ages of 14 and 16 (including your 16<sup>th</sup> birthday) or for 13 weeks after your 16<sup>th</sup> birthday. If you are not sure whether you qualify for support you can contact the Leaving Care Team or speak to your Social worker or keyworker.

NB All care leavers have a Legal status and they are all entitled to access this offer with the exception of 'Qualifying ' young people, who are limited to Advice and Assistance and support for a Vacation accommodation if studying at university. Your social worker or personal adviser will explain your legal status with you.

# Details of Derby City Council's Local Offer of Services and Support to Care Leavers.

This offer can alter dependent upon how old you are as a Care Leaver. This document identifies which age applies in each section. We will also clearly identify what services and support we **must** provide and what we **choose** to provide.

The age ranges are;

16 to 17

18 to 21

21 to 25.

To make this offer clear and easy to understand and follow we have used the following sub-headings.

Support and Advice.

Education, Training and Employment.

Accommodation & Independence.

Your Health.

Your Money and Finances

Your relationships.

Your Identity and Participation in society.

Being Heard

The leaving care team will also consider with you what extra support you may need, for example you may need additional support because;

You have special educational needs or a disability

You are an Unaccompanied Asylum Seeking Child **(UASC)** and your immigration status is unclear

You are leaving custody or have been in contact with the criminal justice system

You are a young parent

You are going through a difficult time in your personal life.

NB. UASC will be entitled to the same provisions as other children in the country and entitled therefore to this offer. They do however have an immigration status (applying for asylum, acceptance as a refugee, granted leave to remain or refused leave to remain) and this will be taken into account when considering the provision of services. UASC will be clearly informed about the affects their status has on Leaving Care provision by their PA.
