## 327/04 Public Order Act 1986

The Council Cabinet considered a report of the Director of Corporate Services setting out a request from the Deputy Chief Constable of Derbyshire Constabulary to make an order under Section 13 of the Public Order Act 1986 prohibiting the holding of all public processions in the city from 1200 hours on Tuesday 15 March to 1200 Hours on Saturday 19 March 2005.

#### **Options Considered**

The only other option was not to make an order.

#### Decision

- 1. To authorise the Director of Corporate Services to seek consent of the Secretary of State to the making of an order to prohibit all public processions in the city from 1200 hours on 15 march to 1200 hours on 19 March 2005.
- 2. To authorise the Director of Corporate Services to take any further action in this matter in consultation with the Leader he considers necessary in the interests of maintaining public order.

#### Reason

The Deputy Chief Constable has applied for the Council to make such an order as he believes that other powers will not be sufficient to prevent the holding of public processions from resulting in public disorder.
