CONSULTATION ON 2011-2014 VISION, PRIORITIES AND STRUCTURE FOR CHILDREN'S TRUST

SUMMARY

- 1.1 The new coalition government has made significant changes that will impact on the way children's trusts and partners operate. These include the reform of children's trusts, the health white paper and associated proposals on the future of PCTs and GP commissioning, the Academies Bill and the role of schools as commissioners, increasing localisation and the end of the Police Authority and the Strategic Health Authority. Another important change is the transfer of responsibility for public health to local authorities and the need to establish a Health and Wellbeing Board. All these things will affect the current Children's Trusts.
- 1.2 In response to this period of change the Executive received the attached report and was asked to give a clear steer on the future of Derby's children's trust arrangements and the commitment to partnership working.
