5	<p>Derby Homes Update</p> <p>Emma was asked what Impact does the spending cuts affect services. Are they impacting on service delivery? The question related to the Bedroom tax issue. 931 houses being affected with bedroom tax - Jack will send info onto Chris Wynn. Some people are being offered a payment to move.</p> <p>Police update</p> <p>Inspector cannon introduced himself as new to area, Rob has come along to give background on the area. Brief history of career given. Aims of role in the area. Darley concert very busy and there was some car damage on Folley road. Issues remained very low. They were close to towing a car in the village when at last minute the owner was tracked down. There was a little trouble that was a little further out. Chris Wynn said it was well organised and was very happy with it. Youth provision - st Anne's church is closing however st alkmunds church will re house the group. Darley abbey mills jumping in the river, police are moving people off Jane Harrison has had fence put up too which has prevented easy access to the river. Asb in west end area, some involved in youth club so easy to target. Bike and shed thefts falling off a little, targeting known offenders to make it uncomfortable for them to continue. Street drinkers are being pushed put out of city centre. Working with charities to get a long term solution to their problem. Check if the alcohol free zone on north parade is enforceable.</p> <p>Youth update</p> <p>Venue change as mentioned above Night may also change but negotiations are currently taking place Discussions are to take place in the near future to discuss terms and conditions. PCSO Linda Ball has been round venues to try and find somewhere to accommodate youth club. Chris updated on the team and other support service around him as a worker which includes intensive family support workers, connections.</p>	ZN
6.	<p>20mph Zone</p> <p>20 mph update- sub group Council decided that the decision would be devolved to the board to impose any 20mph zones across the city. This would also include any funding that is attached to a scheme. It can also be included as one of the Boards Local Transport Plan Priorities.</p> <p>Also as a sub group would look at a opt out process and roll out 20mph zone throughout the ward. It's designed to establish a ward that people visit and not drive though. The plan is not aiming to achieve instantly but over the coming years.</p> <p>Jack said opt out would incur a costs before the resident had chance to have a say and that 20mph should be resident led and put into streets where residents wanted it.</p>	ZN

	<p>Paul chamberlain - careful that criteria is met and is supported by the enforcement body (police) existing speed the guidance says should be 24mph to introduce.</p> <p>York adopted city wide, Sherwood in Nottingham are also adopting it.</p> <p>Chris voted against 20mph zone because most people will only be doing 20 anyway and the people that speed down the street wouldn't take any notice of the signs anyway.</p> <p>Signs need to be put up as you enter the area.</p>	
7.	<p>LTP priority 2014/15</p> <p>Talked about cycle rack at ked road shops however it is possible to fund these out of the Streetpride devolved budget.</p> <p>20mph at city road is an option that the majority agree with.</p> <p>Traffic turning left out of Ferrers way onto Duffield road is a dangerous turn, the radius could be extended.</p> <p>Watson street link - open old footpath to Kedleston Road.</p> <p>Slurry sealing - John Britain suggested that these be left to future years because of works planned.</p> <p>The Board want to deliver something tangible in the ward rather than too many investigations.</p> <p>City road from list provided to tie in with 20 mph zone. As 2 priorities</p> <p>Martin arrived at 8pm</p> <p>Andrew Meehan - survey 110 responded with support high for 20mph zone. Sub group can put a little more meat on the bones.</p> <p>Reserve discussion</p> <p>20mph at top end</p> <p>Broadway round about</p> <p>Watson street footpath -ownership definition needed. CHOSEN</p> <p>Priority 1 – 20mph zone</p> <p>The sub group will meet on the 5th September to decide on 2 possible areas for implementation.</p> <p>Priority 2 – City Road Traffic calming and rat running following speed survey carried out</p> <p>Priority 3 - Watson Street footpath reserve</p> <p>There are some concerns about the ownership of the land but the footpath needs reinstating.</p>
