The Forum received a presentation on The Local Equality and Human Rights Partnership from Patrick Devine and J Singh Shemare. The presentation explained the position of the Equality and Human Rights Commission to enter into debate on the bill of rights.

The Forum also received a presentation from Kirit Mistry on the Human Rights from a local perspective. It was stated that the rational behind the Partnership was to form a powerful group of people and raise awareness; priority for the Partnership would be to gain support rather than training and consultancy at the present time.
