| Pharmacy Chlamydia Services | This is a chlamydia testing and treatment service open to any young person aged between 16 - 24 years of age who wishes to access the service. Young people accessing the service do not need to be registered with a GP surgery. This service currently has one provider (Manor Pharmacy) and is available at one location (St Peter's Street in Derby city centre). This services is not provided by any other pharmacist in Derby but people wishing to access chlamydia testing and treatment services can also do so via the open access Genito-urinary Medicine (GUM) service (available at London Road Community Hospital) | This service will not be re-commissioned. People wishing to attend pharmacies for chlamydia testing will be sign-posted to other existing open-access chlamydia testing and treatment services provided by the Genito-urinary Medicine (GUM) clinic located at London Road Community Hospital. |
| GP Level 2 STI Service for Students | This is a level 2 STI service (See Appendix B for further information) targeted at and available to studentsonly. This service is provided by Park Medical Practice located at the Kedleston Road Campus for the University of Derby. | This service will not be re-commissioned. Students wishing to access Level 2 STI testing and treatment services will be sign-posted to other existing services provided by the GUM clinic located at London Road Community Hospital. | Pharmacy Oral Contraception | Pharmacies can sign up to deliver oral emergency hormonal contraception within the pharmacy. This is currently FREE at the point of delivery and available to all women of child bearing age. | Pharmacies can continue to provide oral emergency hormonal contraception by being part of an approved provider list. This will continue to be free at the point of delivery but will be restricted to females under the age of 18 years to support the continued reduction in teenage pregnancy. Women over the age of 18 wishing to access free oral emergency hormonal contraception will be provided with options to purchase this over the counter or signposted to their nearest GP surgery, Genito-urinary Medicine clinic or Contraception and Sexual Health services. |
