# Outcome of the Consultation on Changes to Taxi Licensing Administration & Decision Making

#### **SUMMARY**

- 1.1 At Council on 18 May 2016, it was agreed to undertake a review of the taxi licensing processes and procedures. A series of proposals and recommendations were agreed. A consultation exercise with the trade and the public as primary stakeholders of the Council's licensing function on the proposed changes was also approved.
- 1.2 At Licensing Committee on 14 July 2016, the proposed consultation scheme for approval by the Cabinet Member for Regulatory Services was considered.
- 1.3 The consultation exercise has been undertaken and the report sets out the results of the responses received.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

- 2.1 Consider the details of the results of the consultation exercise set out in the report.
- 2.2 Make any appropriate comments, for consideration by the Cabinet Member.

#### **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

3.1 To give effect to the mandate given by Council at its meeting on 18 May 2016.

# **SUPPORTING INFORMATION**

4.1 At Council on 18 May 2016, members considered and approved a set of recommendations that requested officers to undertake a review of the taxi licensing processes and procedures, and consider and propose an administrative scheme for determining licence applications, to include the renewal of hackney carriage and private hire licences.

- 4.2 It was acknowledged that robust principles, processes and procedures would be needed to enable the implementation, from an agreed date, of a new system for making clear and consistent decisions which are in the public safety interest.
- 4.3 Underpinning the proposal was a need to consult with the trade and relevant stakeholders about the proposals which were detailed in a report considered by Licensing Committee on 14 July 2016 and attached at Appendix 2 by means of background information.
- 4.4 A twelve week consultation exercise has been carried out. Views and comments have been sought on a range of questions. The exercise was published on the Council's Your City Your Say website pages. All licence holders have been contacted with details of the exercise and how to respond. Hard copies of the consultation questions have also been made available at the licensing counter and a copy of this information has been included at Appendix 3. Details have also been circulated via social media and through the Council's Forum meetings.
- 4.5 Information setting out details on the results of the consultation exercise is set out at Appendix 4.
- 4.6 As part of the online process, a number of further comments about the proposals or other suggestions have been made and these are set out at Appendix 5.
- 4.7 Also, separate to the online process, a number of letters of correspondence have been received as part of the consultation process. These are set out in Appendices 6, 7, 8 and 9.
- 4.8 On 23 November 2016, the results of the consultation exercise will be considered by Council who will make a final decision on what changes, if any, are to be introduced and by when.
- 4.9 Committee is asked to consider the information set out in the report and make any appropriate comments, for consideration by the Cabinet Member.
