STREETPRIDE BOARD UPDATE 30th May 2012

Streetpride Devolved Budget 2011/12 Update

Works Completed

- Cast iron street signs have refurbished and painted across the ward
- Welcome sign has been installed at Cheviot Street Open Space
- 2 x benches have been installed on the skating area on Cheviot Street Open Space
- Roll out of the dog fouling campaign which included:
 - Poster campaign in hot spot areas (i.e. New Zealand and around parks)
 - o Purchase of dog poo bags for distribution to residents
 - Stickers placed on all litter bins to highlight that they can be used for the disposal of dog waste
 - Purchase of 12 x handi-scoops for distribution to those that require them (i.e. elderly or disabled residents)
 - Schools project to get children involved (and who then hopefully pester the adults!) – Presentation and prizes awarded at Ashgate Primary School on 26th January.
- 3 x grit bins were installed on Drayton Avenue, Campion Street and Enfield Road
- Additional gully cleansing took place in the New Zealand area
- Works carried out for the Reigate Primary School Travel Plan
- The 'To Go No Go' road safety theatre production visited Brackensdale Infants, Ashgate Primary and Reigate Primary schools. All children also received a road safety holiday pack which they were able to take home with them.
- Be Safe Be Seen campaign carried out in schools reflectors distributed to all children 9 and under.
- Slurry sealing of footpath on Southwark Close
- Slurry sealing of footpath on Dorking Road

- Installation of additional lighting on Cheviot Street Open Space
- Installation of litter bins on Napier street, Humbleton Drive and Peckham gardens
- Child Pedestrian Training for all Year 2 pupils
