Small Change – Community Cohesion

RECOMMENDATION

1. To note the creation of a new community chest under the Small Change programme.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 Small Change is Derby City Partnership's small grants scheme for the community and voluntary sector.
- 2.2 It is an amalgamation of five different community chests which are managed through a single application, approval and monitoring process.
- 2.3 One of the five community chests is aimed at providing grants of up to £3,000 for community and voluntary groups to carry out activities to promote community cohesion. The grants will be available to all communities in Normanton to carry out activities which:
 - bring together communities from different cultural backgrounds
 - create greater understanding between different generations and communities
 - promote partnerships between different cultural groups.
- 2.4 The fund has been promoted via Derby CVS, the External Funding Newsletter, Normanton News, Area and Neighbourhood Unit and direct mailings to groups in Normanton.
- 2.5 The bid was appraised by a panel including a representative from the Community Safety Partnership who is directing groups to Small Change for funding.
- 2.6 The fund has a total of £120,000 URBAN and £100,000 SRB grant to be spent by December 2005. £21,000 has been allocated so far.
