## Blue bins to replace blue boxes for recycling

Derby householders who currently have blue boxes for recycling tins, glass and plastic bottles will have them replaced with blue bins from next week.

These households joined the Rethink Rubbish recycling scheme before blue bins were introduced and, therefore, received the earlier blue boxes. Residents can keep their blue box. It should not be used for recycling once a replacement bin has been delivered.

## Free Energy Saving Plugs and Light Bulbs

Derby residents will be able to claim free energy-saving multi-plugs, for the first time, and low-energy light bulbs from Derby City Council next week.

They will be available at the Guildhall, Market Place, Derby on Tuesday 23 January, 20 February and 27 March between 10am and 2pm. People on benefits can also claim four of the 300 bulbs available and anyone not on benefits can have a single bulb. Those on benefits will need to bring proof.

### **Top marks for a Mackworth School**

Mackworth junior school recently gained the prestigious Basic Skills Quality Mark.

The award has been given to Brackensdale Junior School in recognition of its high standards of teaching and learning in literacy and numeracy.

## **Tackling Anti-Social Behaviour**
