The Strategic Intelligence Assessment (SIA) is an annual evidence base compiled and analyzed to inform the priorities of the Community Safety Partnership (CSP).




- The Safer Derby CSP Plan 2022-2025 is a three-year rolling document.

- Delivery of this strategic plan is accountable to the Safer Derby Board which provides governance and oversight of the issues affecting Derby residents.
- The delivery of the CSP takes a whole system approach and recognises the influence of place-based risk on residents.
