#### ANNEXES

### NON STANDARD TIMINGS

Additional hour on the terminal hour of St David's Day, St Patrick's Day, St George's Day, St Andrew's Day and Christmas Eve.

Additional hour on the terminal hour of Friday- Monday of all Bank Holiday Weekends.

Additional hour on the terminal hour of Thursday-Monday of Easter Weekend.

Up to 12 events per calendar year, the finish time will be extended by 1 hour beyond normal operating times for occasions of national, international significance or charitable events, giving at least 14 days written notice to the Police.

### **ANNEX 1 – MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

### SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - a. at any time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence; or
  - b. at any time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### DOOR SUPERVISION

3. Each individual required to be at the premises to carry out a security activity must be licensed by the Security Industries Authority.

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —

- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)

Where — P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."

(2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;

(d)) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
(2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
(a) holographic mark or

(b) an ultraviolet feature

4. The responsible person must ensure that -

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –

(i) beer or cider: <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises: and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE**

Embedded right to allow limited entertainment under section 182 Licensing Act 1964 ("two in a bar" and 24 hour recorded music.

- 1. During regulated entertainment involving amplified music or speech, all windows and rooms in which the music or speech is taking place shall be kept closed and alternative acoustically attenuated ventilation shall be provided where necessary.
- 2. During events involving amplified music or speech, all doors to rooms in which the music or speech is taking place shall be kept closed, other than for access and egress.
- 3. No amplified music or speech shall be relayed via external loudspeakers.
- 4. The licensee or a nominated representative shall receive and respond to complaints throughout the duration of all noise generating events.
- 5. The licensee or nominated representative shall monitor the noise from time to time outside noise sensitive premises during every event involving amplified music or speech. At least one such period of monitoring shall be undertaken after 23:00 if regulated entertainment is taking place after that time. If as a result of such monitoring, it is considered that the noise levels are excessive, immediate action should be taken to reduce the volume to acceptable levels. The Licensee's attention is drawn in particular to

the effect of the low frequency bass notes which readily pass through doors and windows and are most often the principal reason for complaining of entertainment noise. The aim should be for noise to be inaudible outside noise sensitive premises after 23:00. A record of these checks and of any action taken as a result shall be maintained in a logbook kept specifically for that purpose. The logbook shall be made available for inspection by a Police constable or authorised person as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003 upon their request.

- 6. The licensee or nominated representative should monitor the effect of patrons leaving the premises from time to time and at least once a week. A record of the monitoring and of any matters giving rise to concern shall be maintained in the logbook referred to in above condition.
- 7. There shall be displayed at all exits, prominent, clear notices requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 8. Disposal of waste bottles into external receptacles (where noise will be audible to residents in neighbouring properties) must not take place between 23:00 hours and 07:00 hours the following day.
- 9. Any CCTV system must be maintained in good working order and be operated when the premises is open to the public. Recordings must be shown to an Authorised Officer or Police Officer if requested.
- 10. You must apply a policy requiring the production of proof of age from any person appearing to those selling or supplying alcohol to be under the age of 18 and who is attempting to buy alcohol.
- 11. Where text/radio pagers are used, they will continue to be used for additional hours of trading and will be monitored by a responsible member of the staff.
