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Joined Up Care Derbyshire Update - development of the Derbyshire Integrated Care System (ICS)

Purpose

- 1.1 This report provides an update from Joined Up Care Derbyshire (JUCD).

Recommendation

- 2.1 To note the update from JUCD.

Reason

- 3.1 To ensure that the Health and Wellbeing Board is informed of, and engaged with, JUCD, ensuring alignment and joint effort as necessary on shared priorities.

Supporting information

- 4.1 Integrated care systems (ICSs) are partnerships of organisations that come together to plan and deliver joined up health and care services. Each ICS will comprise an:
- Integrated Care Partnership (ICP): the broad alliance of organisations and representatives concerned with improving the care, health and wellbeing of the population, jointly convened by local authorities and the NHS.
 - Integrated Care Board (ICB) bringing the NHS together locally to improve population health and care.
- 4.2 Following the passage of the Health and Care Act (2022), 42 ICSs were established across England on a statutory basis on 1 July 2022 and replaced 106 Clinical Commissioning Groups.
- 4.3 NHS Derby and Derbyshire Integrated Care System was locally established as part of this process. This includes the establishment of the ICB – the statutory NHS organisation responsible for developing a plan for meeting the health needs of the population, managing the NHS budget and arranging for the provision of health services in the ICS area. NHS Derby and Derbyshire ICB replaces Derby and Derbyshire CCG.
- 4.4 One of the core areas of Joined Up Care Derbyshire is to recover from the impact of the pandemic on health care services as a whole. Beyond that, the focus of service delivery will shift to become more preventative and about improving the Derby and Derbyshire population's life expectancy and reducing health inequalities. We want to involve local people more in understanding their priorities and needs, and for them to help us shape the services and support available.

- 4.5 Integrated Care Partnerships (ICPs) are statutory committees jointly formed between the NHS integrated care board and all upper-tier local authorities that fall within the ICS area. ICPs are to bring together a broad alliance of partners concerned with improving the care, health and wellbeing of the population and are responsible for producing an Integrated Care Strategy on how to meet the health and wellbeing needs of the population in the ICS area
- 4.6 Derby and Derbyshire ICP is currently operating in shadow form. Due process is being followed locally to formally establish joint arrangements between Derby and Derbyshire ICB, Derby City Council and Derbyshire County Council.
