OTHER ACTIVITIES UNDERTAKEN

SUSPENSION NOTICES

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees.

10 suspension notices have been served. This gave the licence holder 2 days to pay the money due. 7 annual fees were paid generating £1550. 3 licences have been suspended, of which all are currently unoccupied. £430 in annual fees is still outstanding.

Suspended licences cannot be re-instated until the outstanding fees have been paid.

SKIN PIERCING PROSECUTION

Jordan Bruce, proprietor of the skin piercing business operating at Salamander, 40 Sadler Gate, Derby pleaded guilty at Derby Crown Court to infecting customers with a strain of Pseudomonas bacteria. The affected people were hospitalised and many have been left with permanent after effects of the infection.

Unfortunately, the judge did not award the Council any costs, which were in excess of £40,000, but ordered the defendant to pay each of the injured person compensation of £500.

SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

Officers took part in the national campaign to raise awareness of child exploitation and child trafficking, and the different methods of grooming a child may be subject to.

Visits to pubs, clubs and hotels were undertaken, including private hire operator bases.

Key officers participating in the campaign attended the national theatre play 'Chelsea's Choice' that was presented to local schoolchildren, before visiting the relevant premises together with staff from the Child Protection Team.

ANIMAL LICENSING

Animal boarding licences and pet shop licences expire on 31 December each year. Eight renewal inspections of animal boarding licences and seven pet shop renewal inspections were conducted during November and December. All renewal inspections are pre-arranged. Once granted all licences are subject to at least one spot check inspection during the life of the licence.
