1.	Welcome, Introductions and Apologies	
	Councillor Carr welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions took place. Apologies for absence were received.	
2.	Declarations of Personal and/or prejudicial Interest

3.	Late Items	
	There were no late items.	
4.	Resident only parking in Littleover	
	Justine provided an outline of the proposals for the introduction of resident only parking in Littleover. Justine clarified queries regarding a resident parking scheme.	
	In terms of the result of the survey the Board were asked to ratify the recommendation from the parking sub group to include Crich Avenue and Middleton Avenue but to exclude Lawn heads Avenue as the majority were not in favour of a resident parking scheme on Lawn Heads Avenue.	

A query was raised at to whether Lawn Heads Avenue could be included at a later date should problems arise on the street. In response it was stated that yes it could however, a period of monitoring of six months is usually required and this would be dependent on two factors: Resources available to fund a revised TRO Whether there's capacity within the H&T work programme We are still awaiting approval from the Department for Transport regarding the introduction of Resident parking Zones. Although they are due to received designated sign status so we are hopeful. If this cannot happen there will be bays all over the scheme. The hospital has quoted figures of approximately 170 vehicles being displaced, so we have some indication of the volume of cars. <b>Eastwood Drive</b> reported there is some non resident parking and monitoring will need to continue to assess level of displacement. <b>Balmoral Close</b> Request to introduce a Restricted Parking Zone. Both before and after monitoring is taking place, There was a query regarding timing of the restrictions. The proposed scheme timings are not in line with the Kings Drive area. Proposed to be in line with city wide restrictions. The argument is that it is a locale therefore the same system over the locality. The restrictions also apply over the Bank Holiday. Signage and no bays will be present in the Restricted Parking Zones areas otherwise bays and signage will be used to denote the resident parking areas. There was a query regarding Rough Heanor Road – need for double yellow lines at the junction. It was confirmed that there are in place and the current junction works may be obscuring the markings. There was also a discussion regarding offering financial support to the school to assist with marking out their parking bays. There is the opportunity to extend the yellow lines on Rough Heanor Road should need be identified. Issue regarding parking near the nursery on the doy leg of Chain Lane was raised. It was confirmed that the couble yellow lines at this location will be re
