Proposals for the review of the Health and Wellbeing Board

Purpose

Reason

3.1 To ensure the Health and Wellbeing Board is maximising its capability to promote integration, improve population health and reduce inequalities in line with its statutory responsibilities.

Supporting information

- 4.1 The Derby health and wellbeing system continues to experience significant challenges with many local people experiencing poor health outcomes and substantial health inequalities. The COVID pandemic is exacerbating these challenges.
- 4.2 Alongside this, the health and care system is undergoing significant change and our local Integrated Care System (ICS) and its associated structure continues to develop at pace.
- 4.3 Derby and Derbyshire Health and Wellbeing Boards have undertaken a number of joint development sessions with a further planned to set joint priorities and next steps.
- 4.4 Due to the necessary focus on our response to the COVID pandemic, it is now almost two years since the Health and Wellbeing Board reviewed its Terms of Reference and agreed an outline new Health and Wellbeing Strategy. The Board at that time also agreed to review its sub-group structure and reporting arrangements

- 4.5 It is in this context that the Health and Wellbeing Board needs to consider its role and function within the local health and wellbeing system. This is necessary to ensure that it can most effectively deliver positive impacts on health outcomes and inequalities for the population of Derby and ensure that care is seamless and close to home.
- 4.6 It is therefore proposed that the Health and Wellbeing Board utilises the September meeting for a development workshop to review its function and structures with a view to ensure that it is appropriately placed and best set to achieve its ambitions.
