Report of the Strategic Director of Children and Young People

Inspection of services for children in need of help and protection, children looked after and care leavers

SUMMARY

- 1.1 In November 2013 Ofsted commenced inspections against a new inspection framework on services for children in need of help and protection; children looked after and care leavers.
- 1.2 The inspection framework was published in September 2013 (revised in November 2013) and replaced a number of established / interim inspection frameworks for Children's Services...
 - Child Protection (interim framework introduced in April 2012 to replace the Safeguarding and Looked After Children inspection framework).
 - Adoption (established framework that was last revised in 2012).
 - Fostering (established framework that was last revised in 2012).
- 1.3 In addition to pulling a number of existing frameworks together the 'single' social care inspection framework also includes the introduction of an independent review of the Local Safeguarding Children Board.
- 1.4 Andrew Bunyan, Strategic Director for Children and Young People's Services and Sarah Walker, Improvement Partner for Children and Young People's Services will attend the meeting to give a presentation on the new framework.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS

3.1 Ofsted will inspect all local authorities on a three-year cycle under the new framework. Making sure that staff and members are briefed on the requirements of the framework and the associated judgement areas is critical to Derby's preparations and a 'good' outcome.

3.2 The inspection framework will also assess whether Derby is meeting its' corporate parenting responsibilities and member awareness of this is essential.
