Report of the Strategic Director of Neighbourhoods

Museum Reserve Collections

SUMMARY

1.1 In accordance with the procedure for the active management of museum reserve collections, that was agreed by Cabinet on 22 November 2011, this report seeks approval to dispose by sale of selected items that are no longer required by Derby's museums.

RECOMMENDATION

2.1 To approve the disposal by sale of the items listed in Appendix 2, in accordance with the Council's support for active management of museum reserve collections.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

3.1 The items recommended for disposal are judged not to be of sufficient museum quality to justify their continued retention. Their disposal will help relieve pressure on reserve storage accommodation

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 4.1 On 22 November 2011 Cabinet agreed that Derby Museums adopt a new procedure to actively manage its reserve collections. Central to the active management procedure is a report to Cabinet approximately every three months seeking approval for the disposal by sale of selected items from the Museums' reserve collections. This is in line with the recommendations of the Museums Association, of which Derby Museums is an institutional member.
- 4.2 This report contains, at Appendix 2, the first such list of items recommended for disposal by sale. The list explains why each item is being recommended for disposal and outlines attempts that have already been made to offer them to other museums and, where appropriate, to trace the original donor.
- 4.3 As well as recommending further items for disposal the next report to Cabinet will record the income generated by the sale of the items listed at Appendix 2.
- 4.4 In accordance with the ethics code of the Museums Association, Cabinet agreed on 22 November 2011 that any income generated by the sale of the items disposed of

through this process will be retained by the Museum Service "solely and directly for the benefit of the museum's collections". It is anticipated that the income generated by the sale of the items listed will be minimal.

OTHER OPTIONS CONSIDERED

5.1 All the items listed have been offered, without success, to other museums. Where possible we have also attempted – unsuccessfully – to trace the original donor with a view to offering to return the item.

IMPLICATIONS

Financial and Value for Money

- 1.1 Any costs associated with disposals can be achieved within existing budgets.
- 1.2 It is not anticipated that these proposals will realise more than a minimum of income, none of which will be available for general use by Derby City Council. All funds raised by sale can only be used 'solely and directly for the benefit of the museum's collections' (Ethics Code of the Museums Association).
- 1.3 Any write off of assets will be authorised within the Directorate in accordance with Financial Procedure Rule E8.32, which states that Chief Officers can approve the write off of redundant stock and equipment up to £10,000 if the assets are recorded as an asset within the Council's accounts. It is not anticipated that write offs above £10,000 will occur which need the approval of Council Cabinet.

Legal

2.1 Ownership of the collections is legally vested in Derby City Council. The Council must be able to show beyond reasonable doubt that it has legal title to objects which are candidates for dispersal or sale.

3.1 These proposals will result in a change of emphasis for staff working with museum collections, but have no implications for extra staffing requirements.
