Summary of the project:	<p>Formerly Chaddesden Carnival, the Big 1 is being developed to reflect the communities from the 4 wards of NE Derby. Over 15000 people attended the event last year and this year 20000+are expected. The event acts as a great showcase for the area, and puts the North East of the city firmly on the Events calendar.</p> <p>The event is expected to provide a real boost to the local economy, including surrounding shops, takeaways and public houses, and also to the many stall holders on Chaddesden Park itself, many of which are local voluntary fundraising stalls – an essential part of building strong communities. The event is designed to be an affordable and accessible event for all cross sections of the community with something for everyone, Specific aims include interactive activities, arts and educational activities as well as career information and local services. There are also lots of fun activities which will be affordable for all. Organisations will use the event as a medium to consult with communities on issues that affect them, or their neighbourhoods.</p>
Funding details	<p>The £4,000 pot of money will be used to promote attendance at the event from residents in the North East of the city. This will include costs supporting publicity and promotions, and featured activities and attractions at the park which will be free to visitors. Rebranding the event connects the four wards, and the aim is to use the additional investment to cement this, and bring in more people to participate and enjoy the event.</p> <p>An application has been made to Awards For All to support the arts aspect of this event.</p>

Summary of the project:	<p>A package of four Teenage Behaviour Workshops for Parents of years 9 & 10 at West Park School has taken place in November/December 2008. This programme was set up to determine whether there was an actual need for such parental training and was funded as a pilot by Extended Schools Locality funding, with match funding from West park School. The feedback has been very positive. Between 9 and 24 parents attended the sessions with many more since commenting that they would have liked to have attended.</p> <p>The follow up programme is aimed to start in January for parents of pupils in year 7, 8 and 11. This will</p>

	<p>ensure that all parents of pupils at the school have the appropriate information to support their children. To help sustain the project, commencing September 2009 a programme of sessions for parents at key stages in their child's development will be introduced.</p> <p>The workshops for years 7 and 8 will be on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Drugs & Alcohol – How much do you really know? – presented by Addaction • Handling Teenage Behaviour – the pleasure and the pain – presented by Barnardos • Internet Safety – what you really know including “Internet Grooming” by Derby City Child Protection • Internet Safety – technical what you can do including awareness of social networks, parental controls in Vista – West Park School <p>Year 11 pupils will focus on Drugs & Alcohol – How much do you really know? – presented by Addaction</p> <p>The aim of the workshops is to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduce anti social behaviour and criminal damage • Engage with residents • Improve community cohesion and image of young people <p>Parts of this project are being funded by the school, as it is seen as essential to the welfare of the pupils attending the school and will inform parents of what is happening in school to enable family discussions to take place. Details of the breakdown of the costs of the project are shown below. The whole project will cost £2,138 and this is spread over pupils from all of West parks catchment area. As 23.39% live in Chaddesden ward it is proposed to request 23.39% of the cost. The one other ward with substantial pupils is Spondon and a request was made to their Board on 10 December 2008 and agreed.. West park school will cover the costs associated with pupils outside these two wards plus costs of room hire, facilitating, taking bookings, feedback and analysis, responding to queries.</p>
