Youth Service - No report

Police - Inspector Cannon reported:

- ASB is up introducing new ASB patrols on Friday and Saturday evenings as
 Operation Ingomia to target ASB hotspots and will seize alcohol, serve section
 27 notices and write to parents of any young people identified
- Auto crime is down
- Non dwelling burglaries down both sheds and garages. Police will no longer be applying to The Board for shed alarms as have own supply now.
- Violent crime is down
- Shoplifting is up over the whole Derby North area, meat and drinks main targets. Accounts for increase in crime this year.
- Operation Topaz continued in schools in response to concerns about Mcat.
 Some arrests have been made in the ward. Residents can phone
 Crimestoppers with details anonymously
- Travellers no recent incidents but meetings taking place with Councillors,
 Council Officers and Police to push for more ,preventative measures to be put in place at Cattle market

Councillors and Board members

- Dog Fouling campaign discussion about the campaign and its success at reducing dog fouling and residents positive feedback in some locations.
 However, recognise need to maintain initiative and to use Board funding
- Sussex Circus Parking issues Councillors raised concerns about the parking on footways and abuse of the disables spaces. Agreed that the Board can consider including as a Local Transport Priority for 2015/16 at future meeting. Richard Smail confirmed that the painted markings on disabled bays have been reviewed and will be repainted.
 - Request for two bollards to be installed by the bus stop to prevent vehicle access to the footway. Board noted that there was a need to change behaviour of parking on the footway and in the advisory disabled bays.
