Suspension Notices

Since 25 April 2012, the Authority has been able to serve a suspension notice on those who hold a licence under the Licensing Act 2003, who have not paid their annual fees. In the fourth quarter, 69 suspension notices have been served. This gives the licence holder 2 days to pay the money due, before the licence is formally suspended.

All but 2 businesses paid generating £11,450. These businesses had their licences formally suspended, owing a total of £430. Both premises are currently closed. A suspension can only be lifted if the outstanding fee is paid.
