Corporate Plan 2008-11

SUMMARY

- 1.1 On 15 January 2008 the Cabinet received a draft copy of the Corporate Plan 2008-2011 and supporting action plan for review.
- 1.2 The Corporate Plan describes how the Council will work towards delivering its vision of 'Derby a city for all ages' and is based on the six corporate priorities confirmed by Cabinet in July 2007.
- 1.3 The corporate priorities are supported by a number of key outcomes as detailed in **Appendix 2**. In line with the new Local Area Agreement priorities, two additional outcomes have been included for 2008-11:
 - Building strong and sustainable community relations across Derby.
 - Improving facilities in our neighbourhoods.

Cabinet referred the Plans to Scrutiny Management Commission for review on 29 January 2008.
- 1.5 A final draft will be presented at Council on 3 March 2008 recommending approval alongside the three-year budget proposals.
- 1.6 Subject to any issues raised at the meeting, I support the following recommendations.

- 2.1 To note the contents of the updated draft Corporate Plan 2008-2011 and Action Plan which contains information on how our priorities will be delivered.
- 2.2 To consider the comments referred from Scrutiny Management Commission as detailed in paragraph 2.5 in the main report.
- 2.3 To recommend Council adopt the Plan on 3 March 2008.
- 2.4 To recommend that Council delegate authority to make amendments to reflect up-to-date information, final actions and intended outcomes to the Chief

Executive and Corporate Director of Resources, and to finalise the Plan in consultation with the Leader of the Council.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

1 Council Priorities and Key Outcomes for 2008-11

- 1.1 The corporate priorities underpin our vision of 'Derby a city for all ages' and provide the framework for action planning and resource allocation across the Council. The Cabinet agreed six corporate priorities for 2007-10, supported by 18 key outcomes. In July 2007, Cabinet approved the retention of these priorities as a basis for planning in 2008-11.
- 1.2 The Council's priorities were consulted upon as part of the November 2007 Pointer Panel Survey as reported to Cabinet on 15 January 2008. The priorities are also subject to wider consultation alongside the budget proposals 'Lets Talk Budget'.
- 1.3 In light of the new Local Area Agreement, Cabinet agreed two additional key outcomes to support the priority to 'make us proud of our neighbourhoods'...
 - CP1f Building strong and sustainable community relations across Derby.
 - CP1g Improving facilities in our neighbourhoods.
- 1.4 The full list of priorities and key outcomes for 2008-11 is shown in **Appendix 2**.

- 2.2 The Plan describes the Council's vision and priorities for Derby. It outlines some of our achievements and sets out a summary of our future plans for improvement. - 2.3 The Plan and action plan identify the outcomes we want to achieve in realising our priorities. All actions included within the supporting action plan are supported by key information...
 - The resources that we will deploy to deliver each action.

- Targets and measures to review our success in delivering improvements.
- The risks of not delivering each action.
- Links to internal and external plans.
- 2.4 The targets and measures that support each action will also be set out in our annual Best Value Performance Plan, to be published in June 2008.
- 2.5 Cabinet referred the first drafts of the Plans to Scrutiny Management Commission on 29 January 2008. Scrutiny comments for Cabinet consideration are as follows:

2.6 Officers are continuing to develop the Plan and Action Plan. The review section of the plan is being produced on the basis of quarter three performance monitoring. The financial sections will be updated over the next few weeks in line with the final budget proposals.

3 Next steps

- 3.1 The final draft will be submitted to Council recommending approval on 3 March 2008 alongside the three-year budget. Hard copies of both the Plan and Action Plan will be sent to Members one week before. Approval will be requested for any final amendments to the Chief Executive and the Corporate Director of Resources, in consultation with the Leader of the Council, prior to publication at the end of March.
- 3.2 Hard copies of the published Plan and supporting action plan will be sent to senior officers in the Council, key partners and government agencies. Wider distribution of the Plan will be achieved through Derbynet and the Council's extranet site. Refreshed posters will also be available within the Council to promote the Council's six priority areas.
