Home Energy Conservation – How's Derby Doing? Comments on the draft Action Plan

RECOMMENDATION

- 1.2 It is recommended that the Council lobby local MPs to support the Sustainable and Secure Buildings Bill and to request that current enforcement powers are updated so that the legislation can be properly enforced
