Report of the Strategic Director of Children and Young People's Services

Looked after Children - Annual Update 2014/15

SUMMARY

- 1.1 At the end of March 2015 there were a total of 470 looked after children within Derby City, which equates to a rate of 81.3 per 10,000 children and young people under 18 years of age.
- 1.2 This represents an increase of 6% from March 2014 when there was a total of 445 looked after children (rate of 77.5 per 10,000).
- 1.3 The largest percentage of Derby City's looked after children are:
 - male (61%)
 - aged 10 15 years (37%)
 - White British (70%)
 - have been in care for less than one year (31.5%)
 - have the legal status of 'full care order' (50.9%).
- 1.4 Sarah Walker, Policy and Improvement Manager will attend the meeting to give a presentation on the profile of Derby City's looked after children as at the end of March 2015. In addition to this, members of the Board will be updated on recent trends pertaining to the outcomes for our looked after children, highlighting any areas for further consideration.
