DERBY CITY COUNCIL Report of the Corporate Director for Children and Young People

Determination of Admission Arrangements 2011-2012

RECOMMENDATION

To note and support the Authority's stance on the admission arrangements for Community and Voluntary Controlled schools in Derby City and to note the admission arrangements for Foundation and Voluntary Aided schools in the City.

SUPPORTING INFORMATION

- 2.1 The Code of Practice on School Admissions came into force on 10 February 2009 and the admission arrangements for all schools in the city fully complied with the new requirements.
- 2.2 No comments were received regarding the admission arrangements for Community and Voluntary Controlled Schools.
- 2.3 The authority commented on one Foundation School's arrangements West Park on the basis that the reduction in their Published Admission Number from 250 to 240 may reduce the opportunity for parental preference to be expressed. The authority is considering an objection to the Schools Adjudicator.
- 2.4 Wren Park Primary School has requested not to reduce their published admission number and therefore it will be kept at 54.
- 2.5 There are no changes to the co-ordindate admission schemes consulted on, which can be viewed on www.derby.gov.uk/admissions and clicking on 'Admissions Consultation'. The Derby City Scheme will tie in with the exchange dates set for Derbyshire County Council.

2. The procedure for consulting upon determined admission arrangements and notification, publication, variation and alteration of them is detailed in the School Admissions (Admission Arrangements) (England) Regulations 2009.

4. There is no direct impact upon equality issues arising from this report. The admissions policy ensures that all applications are dealt with fairly and equitably in accordance with the relevant legislation

The School Standards and Framework Act 1998, as amended by the Education Act 2002 and the Education and Inspections Act 2006, requires the council to determine admission arrangements for the 2011/12 school year by 15 April 2010, following initial consultation with Community and Voluntary Controlled schools first, and then wider consultation with other admission authorities.

Attached is the admission limit for each Community and Voluntary Controlled School in accordance with the school's net capacity figure

The oversubscription criteria are as follows:

- Children who are looked after by a local authority in accordance with Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989
- 2. Children who are both living in the catchment area served by the school and have brothers or sisters of compulsory school age still attending the school at the time of their admission.
- 3. Other children living in the catchment area at the time of admission.
- 4. Children who do not live in the catchment area served by the school but who have brothers or sisters of compulsory school age still attending the school at the time of their admission.
- 5. In the case of voluntary controlled church schools, children whose parents request a place on religious grounds as stated on their application form.
- 6. Other children whose parents have requested a place.
- 7. Children whose parents did not request a place by the closing date.

In categories 2 to 6, when choices have to be made between children satisfying the same criteria, children living nearest to the school, measured by a straight line, have priority. The line will be measured from the centre of the home address to the school using the national Ordnance Survey set points. The 'home address' is the address of the primary carer of the child, as shown by who receives the Child Benefit. In category 7, places will be allocated in the same order of priority as for categories 2 to 6. Where children in category 7 have equal priority, places will be allocated to those living nearest to the school, measured by a straight line, as outlined above. First priority outside the normal admission round within categories 2 to 6 will be to pupils who have not been on a city school roll during the academic year of application. Waiting lists for all community and voluntary controlled schools will be maintained for all year groups.

Once the closing date has passed, the preferences cannot be altered – subject to any new Code of Practice changes. Multiple births will be allocated a school together – within the boundaries of Infant Class Size Legislation.

There will be no changes to the relevant area or community school catchment areas for the 2011/12 admissions round. Catchment area maps are available to view from Middleton House, 27 St Mary's Gate, Derby, DE1 3NN or by going to www.derby.gov.uk/catchments

Pupils who have a statement of special educational needs, which the LA considers can best be met in a particular school, will be given priority over all others. The over-subscription criteria do not apply to statemented children

Definition of a brother or sister is having one or both natural parents in common, are related by a parent's marriage or who are adopted or fostered. Brothers and sister must be living at the same address.
