49/06 Call-in – Lancaster Sports Centre

In accordance with Overview and Scrutiny Procedure Rule OS36, the Monitoring Officer had called in for scrutiny the decision in respect of Lancaster Sports Centre (Minute Number 90/06) made by Council Cabinet at their meeting on 3 October 2006.

The request for call-in had been made by Councillors Harbon, Richards and Troup. The Commission was provided with copies of the letter requesting the call-in and the protocol on Call-In of Executive Decisions.
