- 1. A CCTV system shall be always installed, and the recording system must be kept in good working order, any faults should be repaired as soon as practicable. (It is recommended that all maintenance paperwork be kept to evidence that the licence holder has shown all due diligence in maintaining the system).
- 2. The CCTV recording system must be working and recording at all times when the premises are open for licensable activities.
- 3. All CCTV recordings must be retained for a minimum of 28 days. These images must be available for viewing at any reasonable time upon request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003. Any details supplied will be in accordance with the relevant requirements of the Data Protection Legislation.
- 4. The Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) and/or designated members of staff must be able to retrieve and supply a copy of any relevant recordings/images of any crime and disorder related to a police investigation. These copies must be made available as soon as possible but within 48 hours of an official request. Any such requests will be in accordance with the relevant requirements of the Data Protection Legislation
- 5. The CCTV recording unit is to be kept secure, to be opened only by the Premises Licence Holder (PHL) or authorised, designated member of staff.
- 6. Installed CCTV cameras are to be positioned both internally and externally to ensure that all parts of the premises to which the public has access are sufficiently covered (save for any toilet areas).
- 7. Any entry points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering the premises
- 8. All cameras installed will be of a standard that will offer optimum image quality in low light.



### PROPOSED CONDITIONS TO VARY EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE

- 9. All digital recordings to be made in real time (time lapse not to be used).
- 10. All relevant incidents recognised as such by the responsible person, will be recorded in an "Incident book/log" which will be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months; and will be made available upon a request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 11. All staff will be trained in their relevant responsibilities to promote the Licencing Objectives. The management will keep records of all staff training which will be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months; and will be made available upon a request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 12. All relevant staff will be trained in basic drugs awareness.
- 13. The Premises will actively participate in any available local "Pubwatch" scheme whilst one is in operation.
- 14. A "Challenge 25" policy will operate within the premises. Signs will prominently be displayed to that effect.
- 15. A "refusals" register (for alcohol) will be maintained and kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months; and will be made available upon a request by a Police Officer or an authorised officer as detailed within Section 13 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 16. When "Live Music" is being carried on at the premises, all doors, and windows (other than doors to allow entry and egress to and from the premises) will remain closed.
- 17. The Designated Premises Supervisor shall ensure that clear, prominent, and legible notices must be displayed internally at all exits, requesting customers and other users to leave the premises and the area local to the premises quietly and in an orderly manner respecting the needs of local residents.
- 18. Disposable materials will be kept to a minimum to help eliminate problems with litter to the front of the premises. Bins and empty glass bottles will be moved to the relevant bin area at reasonable times ensuring minimal nuisance is caused to local residents during early morning and late evening hours



#### PROPOSED CONDITIONS TO VARY EXISTING PREMISES LICENCE

- 19. Any noise caused from licensable activities will be monitored and any complaints from local residents dealt with in a sympathetic manner. These complaints will be recorded in a specific log for that purpose.
- 20. If a nominated Taxi company is authorised by the premises, they will be instructed to ensure their drivers do not sound horns when waiting for customers leaving the premises. They will be asked to wait for customers if possible, away from residential properties situated opposite the premises.
- 21.The Designated Premise Supervisor will undertake a risk assessment to consider the occasions when there is a requirement for the deployment of Door Supervisors at the premises. Any relevant concerns from the police shall be considered when making an assessment.
- 22. When employed and on duty as Door Supervisors, high visibility arm bands will be worn.
- 23. A register of those Door Supervisors employed and on duty at the premise shall be maintained and shall include;
- *i)* The number of Door Supervisors on duty
- ii) The identity and badge number of each Door Supervisor on duty
- iii) The time each Door Supervisor books on and off duty
- iv) A signature of each Door Supervisor on duty
- 24. This register shall be kept on the premises for a period of not less than 12 months and shall be produced upon request of a Police Officer or other authorised person as defined in the Licensing Act 2003



- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 —
- (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
- (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula P = D + (DxV)

Where — P is the permitted price,

- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
- (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

### MANDATORY CONDITIONS IMPLEMENTED 1 OCTOBER 2014

- 1. (1). The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises."
- (2) An irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises –
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective.;
- (d)) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner).
- (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The Designated Premises Supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
- (a) holographic mark or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that -
- (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
- (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
- (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises: and
- (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### MANDATORY CONDITIONS - EXHIBITION OF FILMS

- 1 No film shall be exhibited unless:
  - a. it has received a "U", "PG", "12A", "15", or "18" certificate of the British Board of Film Classification; or
  - b. it is a current newsreel, which has not been submitted to the British Board of Film Classification.
- 2 "18" Films
  - No person apparently under the age of eighteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "18" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 3 "15" Films
  - No person apparently under the age of fifteen years shall be admitted to any exhibition at which there is to be shown any film which has received an "15" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 4 "12A" Films
  - No person apparently under the age of twelve years shall be admitted to any exhibition unless accompanied by an adult at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "12A" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 5 "PG" Films
  Some scenes contai
  - Some scenes contained at which there is to be shown any film, which has received a "PG" certificate from the British Board of Film Classification, may be unsuitable for young children.
- 6 "U" Films
  - Films suitable for all is any film, which has received a "U", certificate from the British Board of Film Classification.
- 7 Permission of Licensing Authority
  - Notwithstanding the above, a film may be exhibited, or persons, or any class of person, may be admitted thereto if the permission of the licensing authority is first obtained and any conditions of such permission are complied with.

#### ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- 1. CCTV System installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.
- 2. A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.
- 3. Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.
- 4. Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.
- 5. Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol at the retail unit (ex. canned or bottled beer).
- 6. A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises
- 7. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.
- 8. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.
- 9. The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.
- 10. Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.
- 11. "Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol.
- 12. Well trained staff about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment etc.


