#### • CLA accessing education from the children's homes Snapshot taken on 9.11.06: (latest available information)

A Total of 37 young people in the children's homes, of which 29 are compulsory school age

16 have full time timetables (12 in mainstream, 4 at the Pupil Referral Unit (PRU), 2 refusing to attend)

13 have part time timetables (7 in mainstream, 6 at the PRU)

4 have no school placement - places being sought

2 are in a secure unit

4 with school provision are choosing not to attend

• Number of CLA not accessing education from foster care: Snapshot taken on 9.11.06: (latest available information)

3 are not accessing education, 1 due to permanent exclusion, 1 waiting for a school place following a care placement move and 1 excluded for a fixed term

• Number of cautions and convictions (aged 10yrs plus):

13 out of 193 children offended (6.7%) during 1 Oct 2005 and 30 Sept 2006, compared with the number of children offending within the YOS area aged 10 to 17 year old being 574 out of a population of 22,527 (2.5%)

- Health of CLA (looked after for 12 months or more):
- Out of 289 children looked after for 1 year or more, 263 had a dental check and 251 an annual health assessment.
- Stability of placements of CLA- the definition is:

The percentage of children looked after at 31 March with three or more placements during the year

- The outturn figure at year end 31 March 2006 was 9%, with a target for 06/07 of 9%
- Derby 04/05 figure was 8.4%
- Comparator authority figure for 05/06 was 12.4%
- Employment, education and training for care leavers- the definition is:

The ratio of the percentage of CLA on 1 April in their 17<sup>th</sup> year (aged 16) who were engaged in education, training or employment at the age of 19 to the percentage of young people in the population who were engaged in education training or employment at the age of 19

- The outturn figure for 31 march 2006 was 84% (21 out of 25 cases) which compared to the population within that age group (81%) results in a ratio of 1:1.04
- Derby 03/04 figure was 1:1.16
- Comparator authority figure for 03/04 was 1:1
- Comparator authority figure for 05/06 was 1:0.8
