137/05 Identification of Urgent Items to which Call-In will not Apply

Urgent Key Decision

139/05 Public Order Act 1986

The Council Cabinet considered a report of the Director of Corporate Services setting out a request from the Chief Constable of Derbyshire Constabulary to make an order under Section 14A of the Public Order Act 1986 prohibiting the holding of all trespassory assemblies on the land owned by Rolls Royce

Limited at Raynesway, Derby from 0001 hours on Saturday 22 October 2005 to 2359 Hours on Monday 24 October 2005.

Representatives of Derbyshire Police and Rolls Royce attended the meeting to answer questions.

Options Considered

The only other option was not to make an order.

Decision

1. To authorise the Director of Corporate Services to seek consent of the Secretary of State to the making of an order to prohibit the holding of all trespassory assemblies on the land owned by Rolls Royce limited at Raynesway, Derby from 0001 hours on 22 October 2005 to 2359 hours on 24 October 2005.
2. To authorise the Director of Corporate Services to take any further action in this matter in consultation with the Leader he considers necessary in the interests of maintaining public order.

Reason

The Chief Constable has applied for the Council to make such an order as he believes that any trespassory assembly may result in serious disruption to the life of the community.
