





<u>Children In Care Council Update - Corporate Parenting Committee meeting</u> 21st February 2017 13:00-15:00

Since the Corporate Parenting Meeting in November, at the time of writing, the children in care council have met on twooccasions.

1. CICC General Meetings

Meetings follow a consistent format – after settling in and catching up, the young people nominate a chair, refer to the agenda and have relevant guests in attendance before moving onto dinner and the all important prize drawer.

In December, 6 young people attended and <u>The Pledge Revisited</u> at The Council House. The CICC were welcomed by Andy Smith and Councillor Bolton – and were joined by senior officers from DCC to feast on Fish n Chips before moving to The Jacobs Rivers Room to hear updates from each department regarding their Pledge promises. One young person was lucky enough to receive ahamperkindlydonated by the Coperative inDerby. The young people were comfortable and confident during the presentation – the evening featured their own DVD, made earlier in the year to promote the CICC – though they commented, much as they liked the Jacobs Rivers Room, they would like to return to the Council Chamber.

In January 2017, the CICC held their monthly meeting at Volunteering Matters. They welcomed Gemma Dexter for an update about the naming of the well being clinic. They then went onto consider Pledge No 7 "*We will support you to get the most from your education and encourage you to reach all your goals and achieve your potential*" and discussed an event at Connexion's **Training, Jobs and Learning Open Day**. The members attended the event– to see for themselves opportunities available and consider whether those opportunities are communicated to looked after children effectively.
